



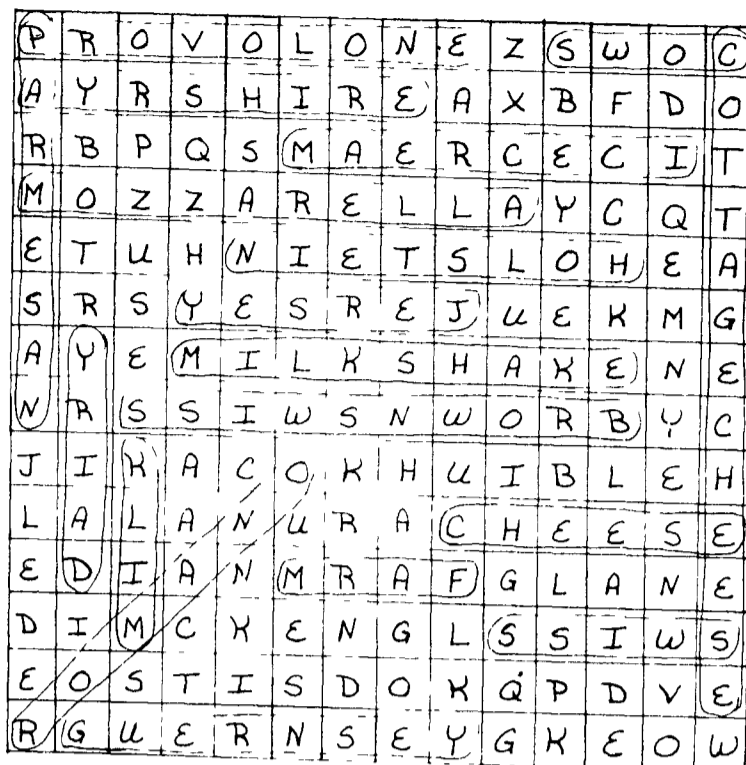
Lancaster Society 18
