MARKET COMMENT: Prices are trending 1 cent higher on large sizes, unchanged on mediums. Cartoned egg orders are fair to good and generally best where featuring is a factor. Supplies of jumbos and extra large are reduced as a result of hot humid weather conditions and orders are frequently cut.

Supplies of large are irregularly distributed and range from fully adequate to tight. Mediums and smalls are easily available and offered as attractive feature items with only limited success. Heavyweight gradable nest runs are sought in many quarters. Undertone fully steady to firm.

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers.
