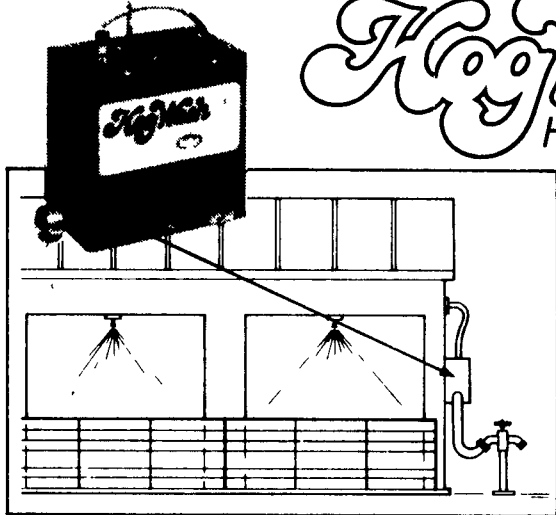
The pageant will be held im-

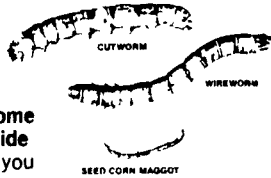

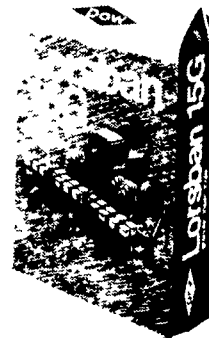
