Combine cream cheese, sour cream, juice and sugar, chill. Combine flour, salt, milk and eggs, beat until smooth.

Heat 10-inch skillet in a 450°F. oven until hot. Add butter to coat pan, pour flour batter immediately

into hot pan. Bake on lowest rack in 450°F. oven for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 350°F. and bake 10 more minutes or until golden brown. Fill with fruit, top with cheese mixture. Sprinkle with almonds. Serve immediately.
