Promotional activity is spotty but stimulates some additional demand. Supplies and offerings are at least adequate on large and lighter weight sizes. Extra large and class 1's are less difficult to procure but remain generally only adequate.

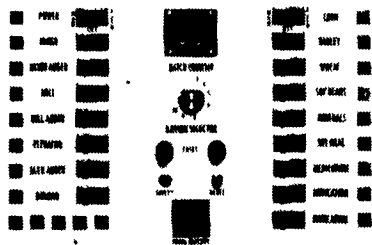
