During the month there were 103 herds with 5,416 cows processed in DHIA program, according to Russel C Seward County Agent Production ranged from a high of 60 1 pounds of milk testing 3 9 percent fat, to a low of 22 3 pounds of milk

In the owner sampler program there were 13 herds with 509 cows being processed. The herds ranged from a high of 53.1 pounds of milk testing 3.7 percent fat, to a low of 22.5.




