Market Comment: Movement of ready to cook whole birds is sluggish and most plants note clearances as very difficult. Inquiries for parts have fallen sharply and most items are highly negotiable today.

Slaughter schedules are reduced overall but remain moderately heavy. Live supplies are at least adequate. Weights are gaining and generally range desirable to heavy. Undertone weak and unsettled.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices are 3-4 cents lower on U.S. Grade A at 55-61 cents.
