SEVEN VALLEYS — Jenelle Boyer bested both older and younger competitors last Friday to claim the honor as York County's top junior cattle showman. Both the fitting and showing contests topped a day of hands-on practice for showing competition, with teams of members given an unbroken heifer calf to clip, wash, fit and halter-break.

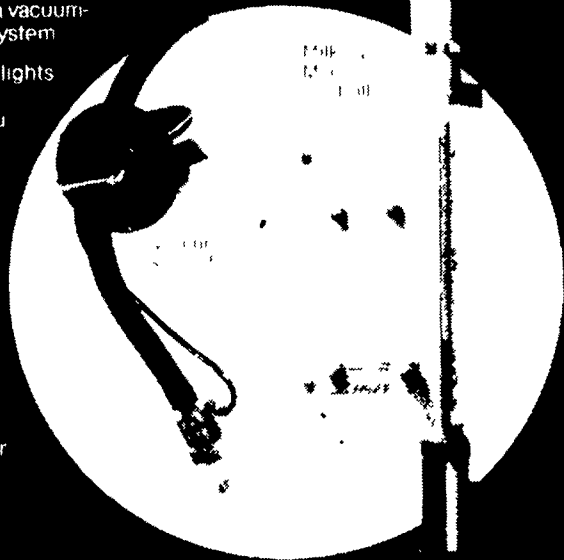
