Ask the Old Farmer: How can I remove some vegeta-ble oil that was spilled on my brick porch? B B , Wil-liamsburg, Va

Try soaking the spots with turpentine Let it set for a few minutes and then scrub the spots with an old toothbrush, adding more turpentine while you scrub As soon as you stop scrubbing, cover the spots with an absorbent material to soak up the oil
