
CENTRE HALL - While both the number of entrants and overall attendance increased over last year's first annual Pennsylvania Angus Breeders Show, two things remained the same at this year's July 14, event.

First, the state's premier Angus event was again held at the Grange Fairgrounds in Centre Hall. And second, a Krueger-owned heifer was again crowned grand champion in open competition.

This year's top female was Parkers Miss Blackbird 503, a Pine

Drive Big Sky daughter owned by George Parker and Greg Krueger and Family of Coatesville. Bred by Nancy Flemming, the March 1983 heifer was also the junior division champion.

And right behind Miss Blackbird was another Pine Drive Big Sky

A few of Pennsylvania's top junior Angus contenders barely had time to catch a breath after attending the national show in Columbus on July 8 to 10. One of those was Eric Ligo of Mercer, who, less than a week after placing fourth in his class in Ohio, went all the way to the top at Centre Hall.

Named grand champion of the junior show was Eric's March heifer, Rains Miss America 0BP88, a Pine Drive Big Sky daughter

Reserve grand champion honors in the junior show went to Queen Victoria 3 of WV, owned by Erica McClellan of Kennett Square. This daughter of Mr. Angus 8017 was also the intermediate heifer champion.

Of the junior show helfers competing for the bred-and-owned championship, DSK Grand Erica 683 was judged number one. Owned by Diane S. Krause of Slatington, this Power Play daughter was also selected as reserve champion in the intermediate division.
