Dawn Hawryluk, Jeff Wagner, Rob Kan, Heather Sowers, and Matthew Irvine from Lebanon County.

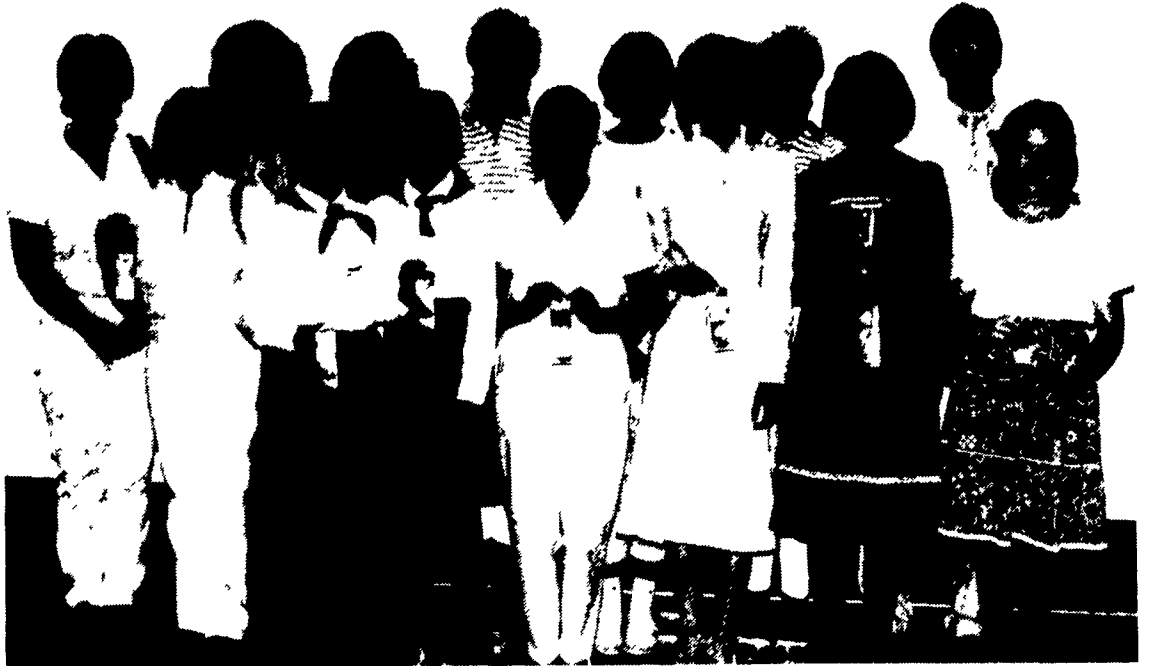
