The reserve champion breederexhibitor award went to East Earl's Dave Fisher, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Fisher.


Jan Waltz, son of Ardith and Nancy Waltz, Manheim, showed the reserve champion middleweight hog, and Scott Charles took reserve honors in the
