## Arborists are best qualified for tree work

FLEMINGTON, N.J. — Many jobs around the home are good do-it-yourself projects. But tree work, especially pruning or removing large trees, is not one of them. Too much risk to life, limb and property is involved when an amateur tries this kind of work. It should be left to professional arborists who are trained and experienced in performing tree care services. Some tree work is very difficult and dangerous; therefore, it is quite costly. But it's a bargain when compared to the costs of

property damage and medical bills that are the potential result of a do-it-yourself job.

Selecting a tree service contractor for the first time poses some risk, since not everyone with a truck and chain saw doing tree work is knowledgeable, reputable, and covered by insurance. Generally, word-of-mouth recommendations from friends or neighbors satisfied with a tree service company will provide reliable references. Persons in allied businesses such as land-

scape contractors and garden suppliers may be helpful. If extensive tree pruning or other maintenance is being considered, it's best to obtain two or three opinions and estimates.

Fortunately, there are many first rate tree service companies with trained and skilled professional tree workers in New Jersey. There are also several organizations operating within the state whose objectives include the promotion of high quality tree care. One organization, the Arborists Association of New Jersey, awards its qualified members the rating of Approved Arborist, who are then permitted to advertise as such.

Since 1940, the state of New Jersey has been certifying arborists by written examination.

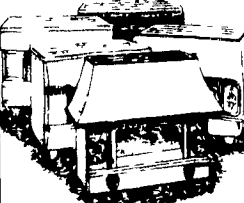
