Contestants placed 4 classes of cattle which consisted of: a cow/calf class, 2 yearling heifer classes and a market steer class. Bill Holloway and Tim Livingston officiated the contest and gave reasons for the placings.

In the junior division, Jamie Kohr, York, the South Central Pa. Cattlemen's Queen, walked away with 1st place, 2nd went to John
