

## Coalter depth control available

BRILLION, WI. — A new hydraulic depth control feature for the cutting coulters on Brillion's most popular sizes of Soil Builders is announced by Brillion Iron Works, Inc., Brillion, WI.

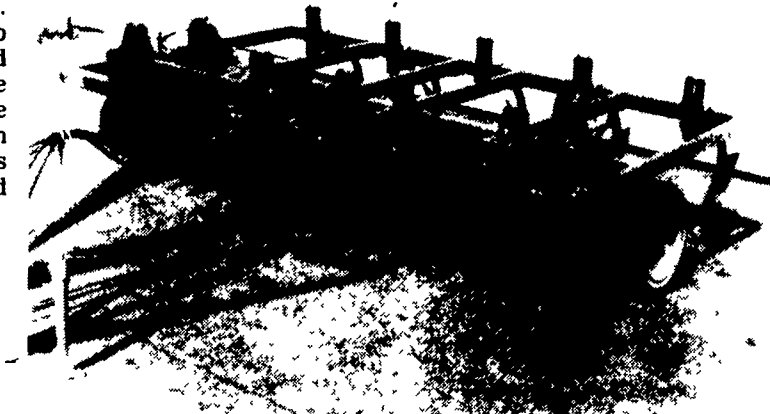
The hydraulic coulters control does not change the maximum working depth of the coulters, but does allow infinite depth adjustments over a 5" range. With the hydraulic adjustment, the coulters can be raised about 3"

higher than standard Brillion CD models.

Kits to convert machines already in the field are also available. If you have a 7, 9, or 11 shank model, for example, your dealer can order a hydraulic coulters control kit for your present Soil Builder.

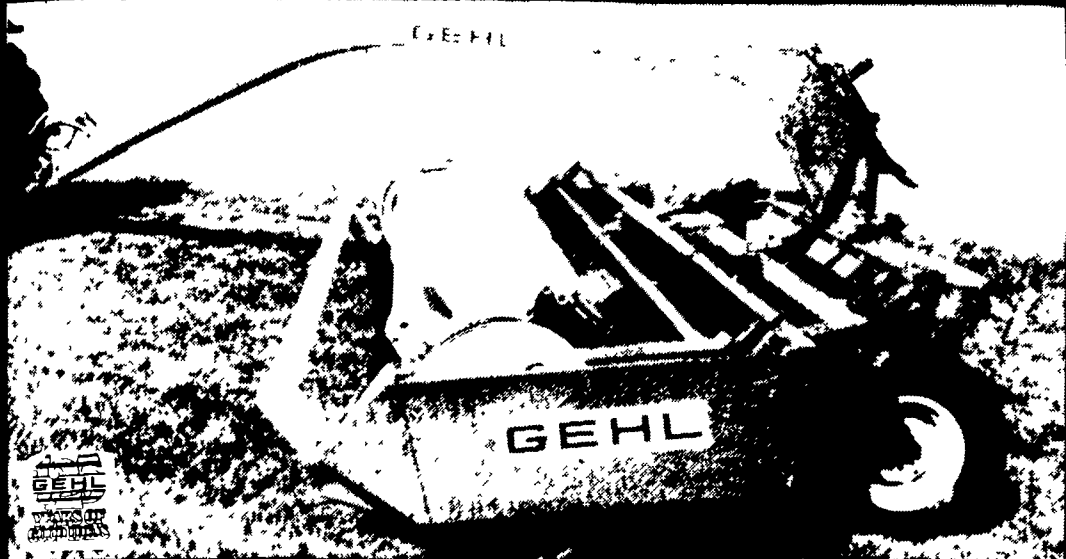
When coulters-chisel shanks are being operated at a depth of less

than 7", the coulters can be raised high enough to clear the ground. Some farmers may want to keep the coulters completely raised when working light-residue soybean ground, or when using the Soil Builder for primary tillage in spring in cornfields where stalks have been gleaned or mellowed down over winter.
