A crowd numbering more than 100 turned out to watch judge Bill Holloway pick the top representatives of the breed at the Pa. Simmental Junior Association Field Day hosted by Reed and Bonnie McCormick of Sky Top Farm.

Allyson Sheaffer, the exhibitor of the show's grand champion heifer, found herself in the spotlight as well, as the Carlisle resident was named the Association's first queen.

Following Sheaffer, with the reserve champion heifer was Lori Cash of Centre Hall, who also took first place in junior division showmanship.

In steer competition, Christen Weaver of State College took top honors, with York's Jamie Kohr exhibiting the reserve champion. Kohr wasn't to be outdone in showmanship, however, placing first in the senior division.

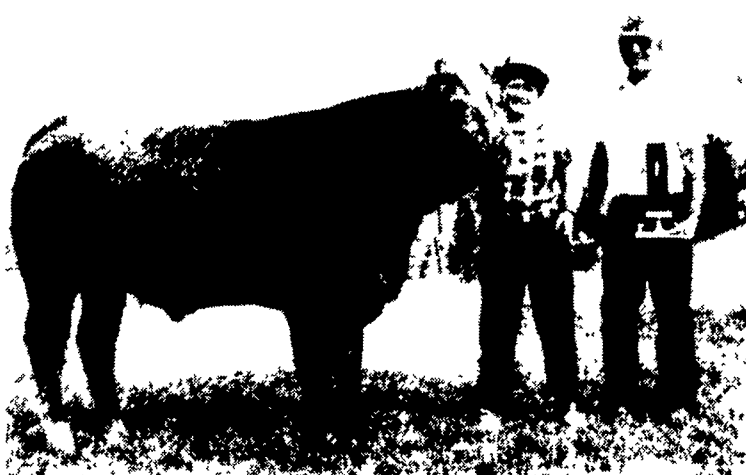

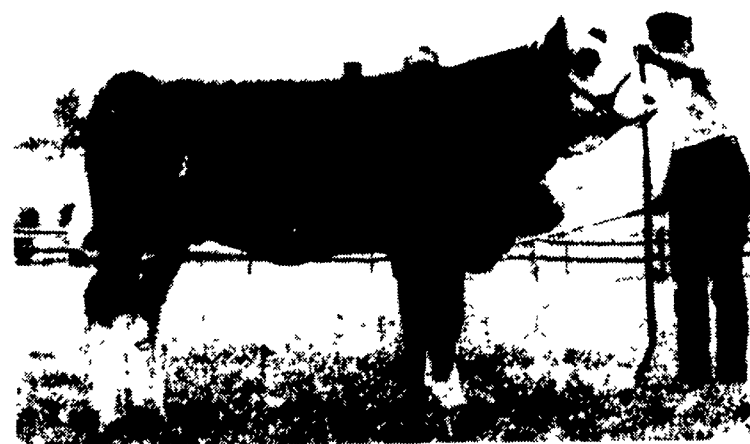
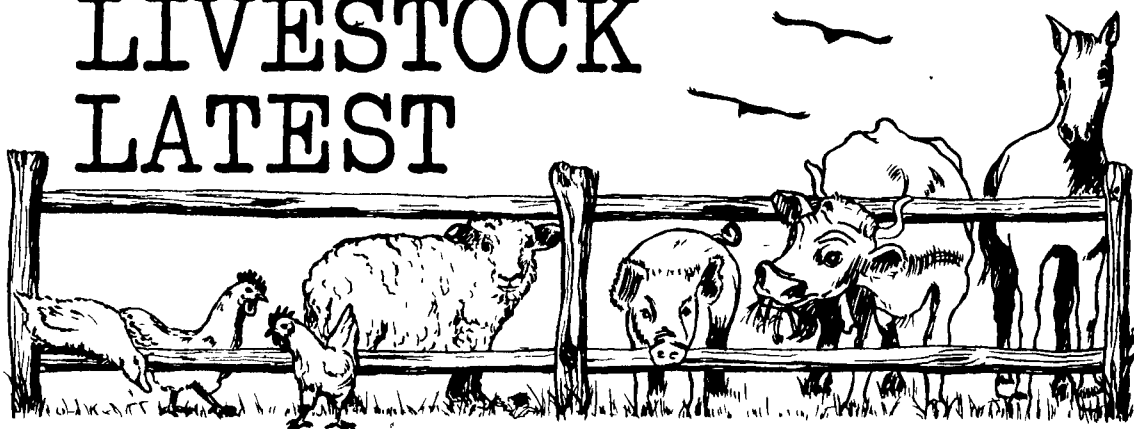


Christine Weaver exhibits her grand champion Simmental steer while her father exhibits her trophy.
