provision were 59 percent, representing 69 percent of the laying hens. Surplus removal was favored by 57 percent of the producers and 60 percent of the laying hens. A destination inspection provision was favored by 34 percent of producers with 32 percent of layers.

A wealth of comments and suggestions were received for the committee's use in evaluating changes which may need to be made in the provisions.

The UEP Marketing Order Committee met in Chicago upon completion of the survey and reviewed the results as well as the suggestions and comments. By a narrow margin, the committee voted to continue further developments of the quantity control provision, approved further work on the surplus removal provision, and strongly voted to continue further developments of the promotion provision.

The committee also voted to develop a quality control provision which would achieve the benefits

sought by the destination inspection provision without the features which were objected to by producers.

Though the UEP had hoped to submit a final marketing order draft to USDA by Oct. 1, the need for further revisions will probably push the target date into the middle of October, Klippen said. After submission to USDA, the final draft will then be the subject of public hearings to be held throughout the country for a period of 12 to 18 months, he added.

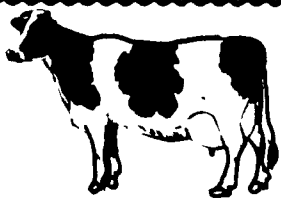
Lancaster plans no-till tour
