The Hoovers strive for top quality alfalfa for the haylage, and, although a bit uncommon for dairy feed, they use anhydrous ammonia on the corn silage to increase the protein by 4 or 5 percent. Dale estimated that this saves them 25 to 40 percent on feed costs since they don't need to buy soybeans, for instance, to up the

Dean explained that they've used anhydrous ammonia in the steer operation for five or six years because it's a cheap source of protein. Some think it's not the best form of protein for dairy animals and may consequently cause health problems.

Although their thoughts can't be proven, -the Hoovers have speculated about the connection between this protein source and a problem they had with twisted stomachs. They've alleviated that problem by feeding a good source of protein in the concentrate, and by improving their management of the dry and fresh cows For the first three days after freshening




