Corn grades clarified

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Effective next Sep-

tember, the U.S. Department of Agriculture will clarify Sample grade requirements and include a definition for "distinctly low quality" in its official standards for corn.

These changes to the official standards for corn do not alter the present grade or grade requirements for corn, said Kenneth A. Gilles, administrator of USDA's Federal Grain Inspection Service.

The revision expands the definition of Sample grade to include previously established limits for stone, glass, castor beans, cockleburrs, unknown foreign substances and animal filth. The revision also adds a definition for "distinctly low quality" corn.
