with her victory, Dean noted that the proceeds from the sale of her top beef will help to finance her Penn State education, where she'll

begin studying animal production next year.

Dean's beef show victory marked the second trip to the winner's circle for the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Dean of Strasburg. In earlier hog competition her 210-pound York-Hamp-Duroc gilt was selected the reserve grand champion in the market hog show. Since her debut in hog competition at age 12, Miss Dean has logged two Lampeter grand championships in 1982 and '83.

Keeping Dean from going all the way to the grand championship this year was Jon Lefever, son of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Lefever of Lancaster.

"I knew I had a real good pig somewhere in my group," (of four entries) Lefever said. This was the first time in the championship ring for Lefever, who has been showing his FFA project porkers for three years. His winning entry was a 235pound York-Hampshire cross purchased from Masonic Homes of Elizabethtown.

Eleven-year-old Livingood lived up to his name in the beef show, garnering champion honors in the 4-H steer show and going on to the reserve grand champion spot in the overall steer competition. Livingood's 1,180pound steer, Blackie, was a Christmas present from his father, Earl Livingood, who helped his son raise the animal at his grandfather's farm a block from their Lampeter home.

Livingood and Blackie also proved to be a winning team in the showmanship competition, taking top honors in the junior division.

'He worked so hard with the steer, and he really deserved to win," beamed Dwain's mother, Mrs. Joyce Livingood while trying to juggle her son's three armlength trophies. Sired by Power Play, the straight Angus calf was bred by Lancaster County exlivestock agent, Chet tension

LAMPETER - Elizabethtown sophomore Lisa Sadler and her Dorset-Suffolk wether named Bartholomew were an unbeatable team at Lampeter's sheep show The daughter of Mr and Mrs Raiph Sadler took grand champion honors in market lamb competition, then went on to the number-one spot in the senior division of the fitting and showmanship contest

Though Miss Sadler had

received reserve champion honors in last year's Elizabethtown Fair and the County Roundup, this was the first grand championship for Sadler, now in her third year of 4-H competition

'I'm really pushing the feed on him now," she said, adding that the 120-pound lamb will be sold at the Manheim Fair The lamb was bred by Gerald Tracey of Elizabethtown

home-bred Suffolk jointly owned by Curt, 11, and Tim Engle, 14, and exhibited by Tim.

The sons of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Engle of Elizabethtown, the Engle brothers point out that exercise plays an important role in developing a prize-winning lamb

We built a feeder that the sheep have to jump up to," says Tim, "and they also have to jump over a board to get into the pen from the pasture." He also points out that frequent walks are an important part of the summer schedule

But if the Engle brothers had to settle for reserve honors in the market lamb show, they were unbeatable in the breeding sheep competition, exhibiting both the champion Suffolk ram and ewe

Three other breeding sheep champions were named, with Jeff Martin showing the champion Dorset ewe; Scott and Michelle Mylin exhibiting the top Hampshire ram and ewe, respectively; and Leonard Brown showing both the top Shropshire ram and ewe.

Judging Lampeter's sheep show

was Chester County extension agent, Cheryl Fairbairn. After concluding the day's sheep events by naming Leonard Brown the winner in the blocking and fitting contest, Fairbairn praised Lancaster County for producing both quality sheep and showmen.
