something that happened in San Francisco Bay and may happen again on the Hudson River.

A firm called Arcorp wants to initiate ferry service on the Hudson between two pieces of property it owns, one in midtown Manhattan and the other in Weehawken, N.J., a route used by

a New York Central ferry until 1959.

Edward Imperatore, the firm's general manager, says commuters would prefer to take a bus to the New Jersey terminal and cross the river by boat rather than get stuck in bridge or tunnel traffic. And planners may end up agreeing with him, though not necessarily with his route.
