COLLEGE PARK, Md. — A major statewide conference to "Enhance Community Vitality" in Maryland will be held Wednesday, Nov. 14, at the Sheraton New Carrollton Hotel, Washington Beltway and highway 450 west.

The daylong conference, open to the public, public officials, and community leaders, is sponsored by the University of Maryland Cooperative Extension Service.

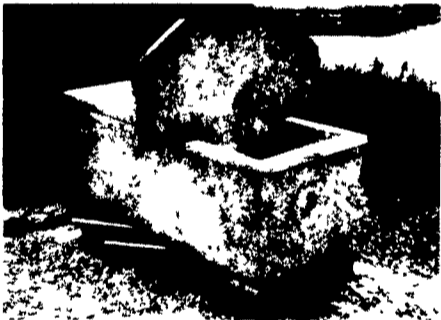

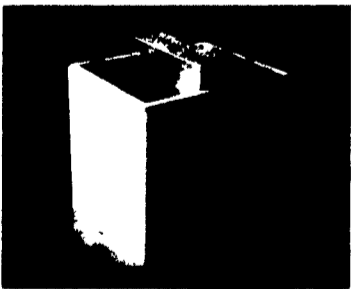
