LOCK HAVEN - The top herd in the Clinton County DHIA for August is owned by Paul L. Courter RD#2 Mill Hall, while the cow completing the highest lactation was owned by Ronald H Meyer RD#2 Box 322 Loganton.

The top herd of Registered Holsteins completed the month with a Rolling Herd Average of 18 491 pounds of milk per cow yielding 706 pounds of butterfat.

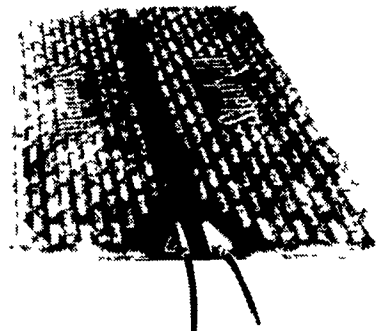

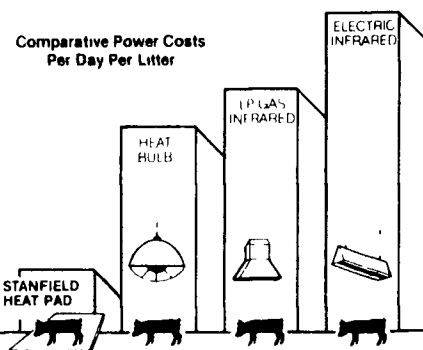

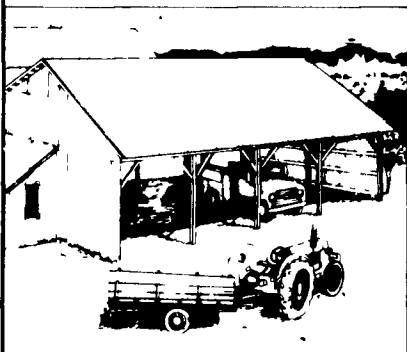
