

Inter-State annual meeting set

SOUTHAMPTON — Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative will hold its 67th annual delegate meeting Nov. 15 and 16 at the Host Farm Resort Hotel, Lancaster.

The two-day event gets underway Thursday morning at 9:45 a.m. with a meeting of Inter-State officers and delegates. At this time, the cooperative's 500 delegates, alternates and others will hear reports from officers and staff members of Inter-State, QC Inc. and Holly Milk Cooperative.

During the afternoon session, Secretary and General Manager Paul E. Hand will present the year's report to the delegate body. Comments will be made by Dr. Elwood W. Speckmann, vice president of nutrition research, the National Dairy Council, and a question and answer period will follow.

Highlighting the annual banquet Thursday night will be guest

speaker Karl K. Kettering. Better known as "Mr. Enthusiasm," Kettering will present the topic, "Up Your Enthusiasm." Musical entertainment will be provided by the Philadelphia Boys Choir and Chorale. Serving as toastmaster will be George Steele, retired chairman of the board, Agway Inc.

Friday morning's session will begin with the Young Cooperator's breakfast program, addressed by guest speaker Richard Norton, Manager of the Middle Atlantic Milk Marketing Area. The general session follows at 9 a.m. and will include delegate action on the annual meeting resolution.

A separate ladies program will run concurrent with the delegate sessions. On Thursday, a choice of either a shopping trip to the Park City Mall or a tour of Lancaster County historical sights will be available. Lunch will be provided at the Good 'N Plenty Restaurant. Friday will feature an arts and

crafts show to begin at 9:30 a.m.

Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative represents about 3,100 dairy farm families in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia and markets more than 2.49 billion pounds of milk.

Order 4 milk \$15.42

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine today announced a Class I milk price of \$15.42 per hundredweight for December 1984. The price is unchanged from November and is 12 cents above last December's Class I price. The Order 4 Class I milk price averaged \$15.02 per hundredweight for the year, down 30 cents from the 1983 average.

Mr. Shine announced a Class II milk price of \$12.72 per hundredweight for October 1984 and a butterfat differential of 18.2 cents for the month, both unchanged from the previous month.

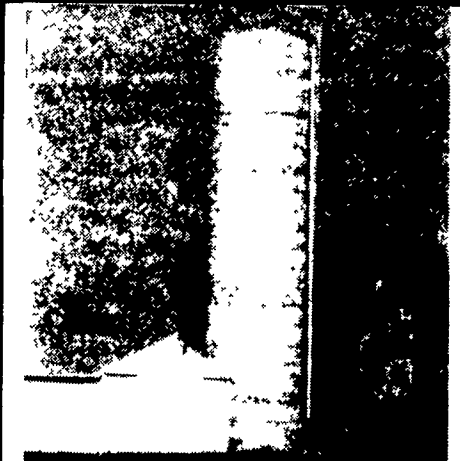
The December Class I price and the October Class II price are based on the October 1984 Minnesota-Wisconsin manufacturing milk price of \$12.64 per hundredweight at a 3.5 percent butterfat content.

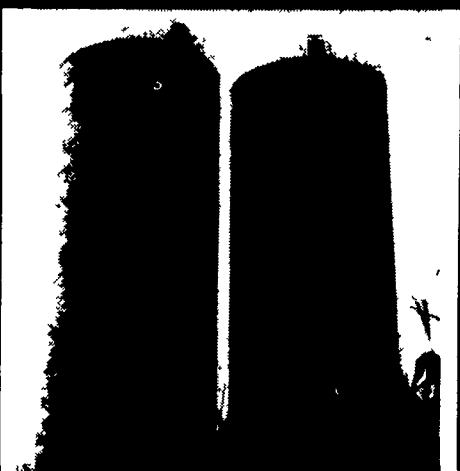

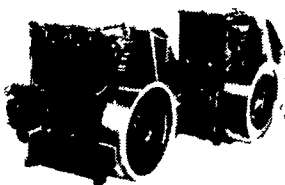

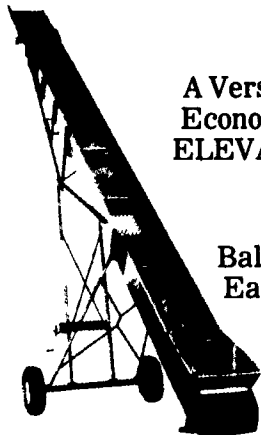
