## Kelly herd has record production in Blair Co.

**HOLLIDAYSBURG** — Thomas W. Kelly achieved the highest herd average for milk, fat and protein in Blair County, according to the annual DHIA summary of the testing year ending September 30th. His herd of 63 cows produced 21,176 lbs. of milk, 771 lbs. of butterfat, and 688 lbs. of protein.

Kelly's herd was the only Blair County dairy to produce over 20,000 lbs. milk. Herds producing over 19,000 lbs. were those of Fred Bechtei, Blackcrest Farms, Clover Will Farms, Marcove Farm, and Charles and Mike Hoover.

Eight herds in the county produced more than 700 lbs. fat for the year. They were: Thomas W. Kelly, Fred Bechtel, Blackcrest Farms, Clover Will Farms, Marcove Farm, Penn-England, Charles and Mike Hoover, and Mil-Ber Farms.

Earning the plaque for the greatest increase in butterfat production was Fred Bechtel with an additional 83 pounds.

Top 2-year-olds were also recognized for high milk, fat, and protein production. Fred Bechtel's "81" topped the fat and milk categories, with 919 lbs. of butterfat and 24,624 lbs. of milk. "Lucy," owned by Charles and Mike Hoover, produced the high record of 910 lbs. in the protein category.

The high cow for milk and protein production was "Termite," owned by Sheldon Fleck. She produced 30,292 lbs. of milk and 960 lbs. of protein at 7 years and 7

"Audrie" produced 1254 lbs. of buttertat to outperform all the other cows in the county. She is owned by Richard Fox and Sons.

Also recognized in the Blair County annual summary were lifetime butterfat production records. Rodney Metzler, Burket Falls Farm, Baker Farm, Marcove Farm, James Smith, Dennis Smith, RichLou Farm, and Aldon-Acres were recognized for lifetime producers.

Blair County DHIA finished its 56th year with 87 whole-year herds

and 6 owner-sampler herds. The county average for milk production per cow for the testing year was down 322 lbs. from last year. Fat production was up one pound. The number of cows on test was down 17 from the previous testing


