Market Comment: Prices are unchanged to lower on large and extra large, unchanged to higher on mediums. Cartoned egg movement was light to occasionally fair. Extra large are adequate to fully adequate and some scattered lots were available. Floor stocks of large were adequate to ample. Graded loose large were easy to obtain locally and class 1's were also available but not to the extent of graded loose. Mediums were adequate to fully adequate and could be found, if needed, from local sources.

Market Comment: Movement on ready to cook whole birds was slow to occasionally fair. Current production was still difficult to clear in some quarters while others had fair clearances due to some prior commitments. Parts movement was sluggish and all items were ample particularly rib breasts.

The overall slaughter was moderate. Live supplies were

adequate. Weights remained heavier than desirable in most quarters. Undertone was weak.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices are .02 lower on U.S. Grade A at .45-.50 cents, and discounting remained prevalent.

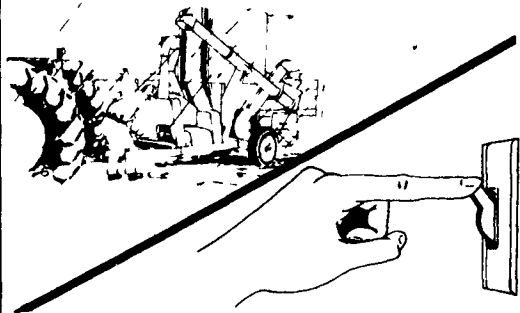
