Palmer inducted into Polled Hereford Hall of Fame

KANSAS CITY, MO. - George C. Palmer II of Charlottesville, Va., has been selected by the American Polled Hereford Association (APHA) board of directors for induction into the Polled Hereford Hall of Fame

His bronzed hat will be hung in the AFHA Hall of Fame in Kansas City, Mo., as a fitting tribute to his outstanding contributions to the breed's progress. The official induction ceremonies will take place during the 62nd National Polled Hereford Convention-Show-Sale in Fort Worth, Texas, Jan. 23-

Since buying his first Polled Hereford bull in 1946, Palmer has been a strong supporter of both the Polled Hereford breed and the entire beef cattle industry. Palmer made his first Polled Hereford purchase for Riverdale Farms following an intensive search for "just the right animal." After serving as a pilot in the U.S. Army Air Corps in World War II, Palmer returned to Virginia and pur-chased a Choice Domino 39 son to use on his Hereford cow herd.


Palmer feels that performance records are essential for the registered breeder, and enrolled his herd on the Virginia Beef Cattle

Improvement Association (BCIA) program in 1954. He has been working with APHA's Guide Lines program since its inception. He has also been highly influential in the Virginia Beef Cattle Improvement Association and has served as their president. In 1981, the Virginia BCIA selected Palmer as their Seedstock Producer of the Year.

He has also served as president of the Eastern Polled Hereford Association (PHA), and as a director on the state fair board, the Virginia Cattlemen's Association and the Virginia Hereford Association. The Virginia PHA selected Palmer as the recipient of the John H. Royer Service to the Polled Hereford breed award in 1980. In 1972, Palmer was elected to the American Polled Hereford Association Board of Directors, and in 1973-74 he served as the Chairman of the Board.

In addition to operating Riverdale Farms since 1950, Palmer has been president of Piedmont Tractor Company Inc., a retailer of John Deere farm and industrial equipment.

Palmer and his wife, Susanne, are the parents of a son and daughter.


