

Agway supports research

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — Twenty-two dairy and livestock research projects at 11 northeastern universities are being supported by Agway financial grants-in-need during 1984-85.

Dr. Darwin G. Braund, director of dairy and livestock R&D at Agway, presented checks totaling \$49,000 to university researchers attending the recent Agway College Dairy Conference. This annual Agway-sponsored conference brings together university researchers and industry and agricultural experts to discuss current trends and research findings in the dairy business.

The 22 research projects partially supported by Agway involve

nutrition and management areas of major concern to the dairy and livestock industry in the Northeast.

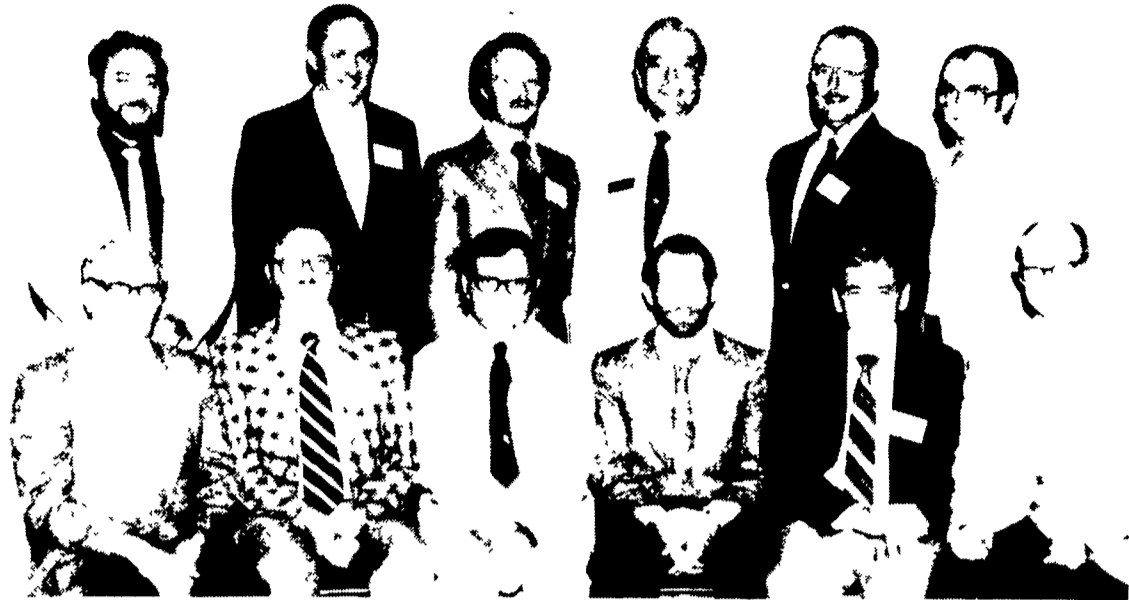
Universities receiving Agway support for these research projects include: University of Connecticut, Cornell University, University of Maine, University of Maryland, University of Massachusetts, University of New Hampshire, Ohio State University, Penn State University, Rutgers University, University of Vermont, and West Virginia University.

About 45% of the funds were allocated to basic or fundamental research with 55% distributed to what could be called applied projects - those with a relatively shorter time required for potential

application of results. In addition to support of university research, Agway conducts applied research at the

450 acre Agway Farm Research Center near Tully, NY. Agway and 15 other U.S. and Canadian cooperatives work together as

Cooperative Research Farms to support applied research in a variety of dairy, livestock, and poultry enterprises.




