Compared with last week choice slaughter steers closed .50 to 1.00 lower with good grade 1.50 to 2.00 lower. Choice slaughter heifers sold 1.00 to 2.00 lower with good heifers 2.00 to 3.50 lower. Cows advanced 2.00 to 3.00 Monday, but declined 2.00 Wednesday to close mostly steady, instances 1.00 lower. Bulls were not well established throughout the week

with limited sales fully steady. Supply good to average choice slaughter steers and heifers with 23% cows. Receipts this week about 2400 as compared with 858 last week and 2490 a year ago.
