Broiler **Placements**

PENNSYLVANIA: Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending January 19, 1985 were 1,894,000, 3 percent above the previous week and 22 percent above the corresponding week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 9 weeks were 10 percent above a year ago. Settings for broiler chicks were 2,493,000, 6 percent below the previous week but 21 percent above the same period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 30 percent above the comparable period a year ago.

19 STATES: Placements in the 19 States were 86,409,000, 1 percent above teh previous week and 8 percent above the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 9 weeks were 6 percent above a year ago. Settings were 108,974,000, fractionally below the previous week but 8 percent above the same period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 10 percent above

the comparable period a year ago. EXPECTED MARKETINGS: Expected marketings, based on placements 7-9 weeks earlier less mortality allowance, in Pennsylvania for the week ending March 16, 1985 will be 1,779,000. Comparison to last year is not

available. The 19 States expected marketings should total 80,659,000, 6 percent above last year.




