The District is offering a wide variety of quality stock three-year old tree seedlings at a very low price. Pre-paid orders will be taken until March 31, 1985.

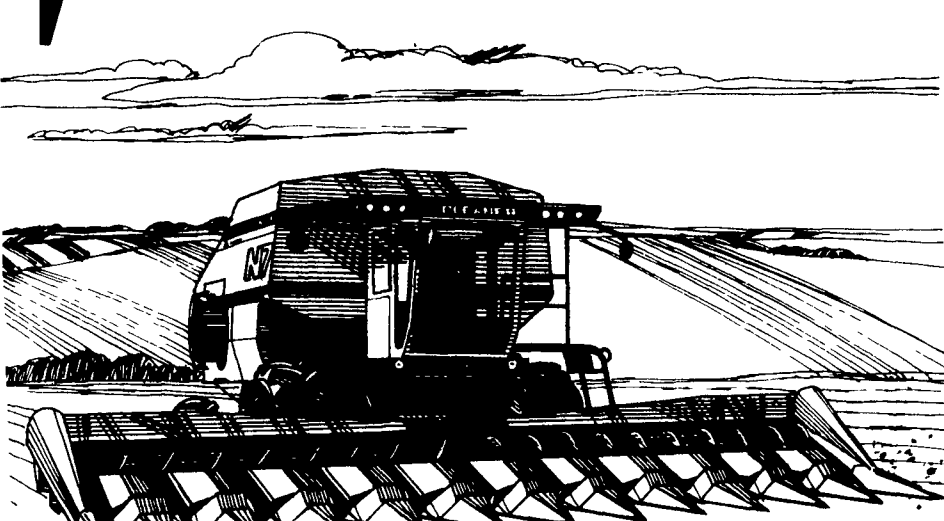
The pick up dates are Friday, April 26 and Saturday, April 27. Seedlings can be picked up at the rear of the Agricultural Center across from Berks Heim on County
