WASHINGTON - The Farm Credit Coordinating Group held its first meeting recently and discussed ways the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation could better coordinate their efforts in communities where a bank has failed, Secretary of Agriculture John R.
