Dauphin plans tree planting

HARRISBURG — Join in Celebrate 200!, Dauphin County's Bicentennial, by planting trees on Arbor Day. The Dauphin County Conservation District observes Arbor Day by conducting an annual seedling sale.

According to Duayne Forsberg, Resource Specialist with the Conservation District, "Arbor Day is a sure-fire way to show your faith in the future. The trees you plant today could be there for your grandchildren to enjoy 100 years from now during Dauphin County's Tri-centennial."

The following evergreen or coniferous species available for sale this year: Douglas Fir, Colorado Blue Spruce, Scotch Pine, and Canadian Hemlock.

Deciduous species available are: European White Birch, White

Flowering Dogwood, Tulip Popular and Thornless Honey Locust.

The size of these three- and four-year-old bareroot seedlings range from six inches to 24 inches for the conifers and 18 inches to 36 inches for the deciduous species. A bundle of ten conifers will sell for \$4 and the deciduous seedlings will sell for \$1 each.

Seedlings must be purchased by placing a prepaid order. Individuals interested can call the 24-hour "EVERGREEN LINE" at 558-1092 or write to the Dauphin County Conservation District, 1205 South 28th Street, Harrisburg, PA 1711-1095 to request an order form. The deadline to order seedlings is April 3. Orders will be available for pick-up on Thursday, April 28.

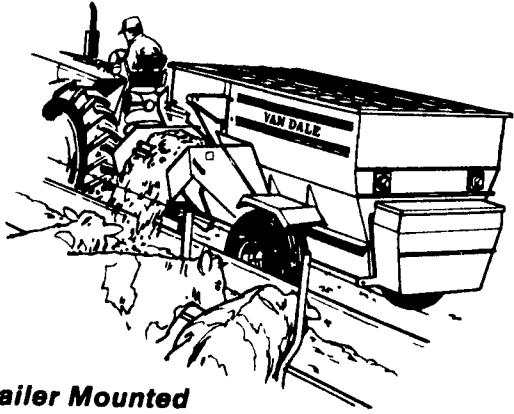

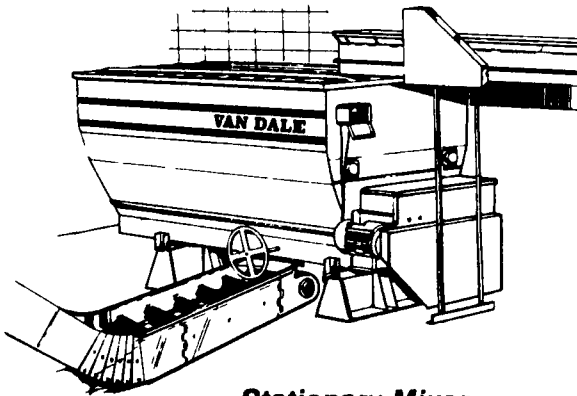

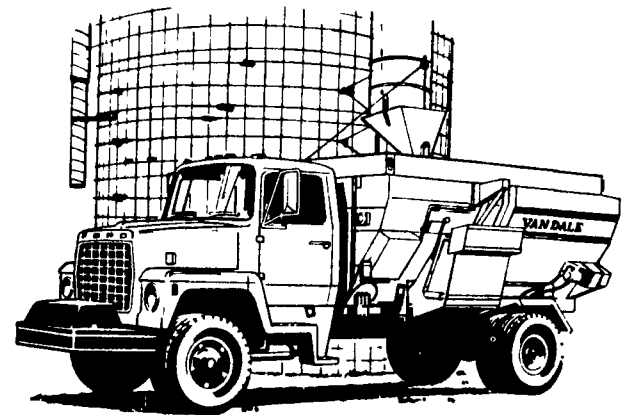
