done by Clyde Myers and Judy Stoudt, Berks County extension, throughout Berks County. Fifty dairy farms will be checked at random and water quality will be charted.

Sid Barnard, PSU extension food scientist, continued the day's program with his discussions on milkfat tests and milk composition and flavor.

He started out by praising the dairymen. "You're doing a top-notch job of keeping antibiotics out of milk," he stated. About 2000ths

of one percent, or two out of every 10,000 dairies have had problems. "But you still have a big jump," he added. "Regulations say absolutely none."

In 1984, Barnard conducted a survey on milk quality and flavor. A big problem, according to Barnard, was the temperature it was stored at in the stores. "Your milk has to be under 40 degrees; my belief is that milk in stores should also be under 40 degrees." Eleven percent of places checked were found to be over 45 degrees.

"An area I feel that there are real problems is flavor," he

continued. "Our concern should be for the children in schools." "They just know if they like it or don't like it," he said. Out of 673 samples tested for flavor, 28.9% tested poor, and of the poor samples, 68% were rancid.

According to Barnard, rancidity starts on the farms. Dairymen should watch their handling and cooling procedures. "We don't need any milk out there that doesn't taste good," he concluded.

Donald Duncan, R1, Robesonia, representing the Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion Advisory Board, brought farmers up to date on current legislation, advertising expenditures, and plans.

He introduced the new logos for Pennsylvania dairy promotions — "Make It Milk" and "Pennsylvania Dairy Country."

"We want to get it (the logo) known for a quality product," he stated.

He also reminded dairymen that March 15th is the deadline for applications from organizations requesting funds. "We're going to try to do more," he stated. The board will not fund capital investments, radio ads, dairy princess pageants, or travel expenses. "We're hoping the local groups come up with some new and different ideas," he added.

The Board is currently financing a blood serum - cholesterol level research project. "I think we're going to come up with some very

positive figures on this," Duncan stated.

They are also developing milk truck logos for consumers to identify the large, shiny milk trucks on the road. "It's some very cheap advertising," Duncan said.

Other plans include a Pennsylvania Dairy Recipe Contest with a grand prize of \$1,000.00, signs to be placed along highways, and a study to determine how effective current advertising is.

"I'm afraid that Americans are probably drinking their fill of beverages," Duncan warned. "It's up to the American farmer to take some away and have them put in milk," he concluded.

Resale pricing committee elects chairman

HARRISBURG — Members of the Joint Study Committee on Resale Pricing elected Rep. Carmel Sirianni chairman at their first meeting on Wednesday in Harrisburg.

Siranni, Hop Bottom, currently serves as minority chairman of the House Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee.

The new study committee was formed to study resale pricing of milk when the General Assembly was considering Sunset legislation dealing with the Pennsylvania Milk Marketing Board and the state's Milk Marketing Law late last year.

The committee, made up of consumers, milk dealers and

producers, and the majority and minority chairmen of the House and Senate Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committees, called on an advisory committee to provide them with the information they need to decide the future of mandatory milk pricing in Pennsylvania.

The advisory committee assigned to assist the study committee consists of the chairman of the Milk Marketing Board, the Penn State's dean of agriculture, the dean of the Wharton School of Business and their staffs.

The study committee has scheduled their next meeting for Thursday, May 2.
