

## Delaware students win Farm Credit scholarships

NEWARK, Del. — Juliet Marshall and Joshua J. Willey III, both plant science majors at the University of Delaware, have won \$500 Delaware Farm Credit scholarships for the current academic year.

Marshall, a junior studying agronomy, has a 3.9 grade point average and is in the university honors program. She is an officer in the collegiate chapter of Future Farmers of America (FFA) and also serves on the AG College Council. She spent last summer collecting field data for the university's Soybean Task Force, a joint research and extension project funded in part by the Delaware Soybean Board and aimed at identifying the key

factors which affect yield in this crop. Marshall recently won a similar

agriculture-related extension, government work, or research.

Willey was last year's junior Farm Credit winner and received a renewal of this scholarship. Now a senior, he is studying for a career in the wholesale nursery industry. Since 1981 the Delaware Farm

Credit associations have awarded two scholarships annually to students majoring in some aspect of agriculture at the university. Awards are based on merit. Recipients must be full-time students and their parents or guardians must reside in Delaware.




