LOCK HAVEN — Paul L. Courter, Mill Hall, led the Clinton County Dairy Herd Improvement Association for February. The top herd in the Clinton County DHIA for February is owned by Paul L. Courter, Mill Hall, while the cow completing the highest lactation was owned by Ken Yearick, Mill Hall. The top herd of registered and grade Holsteins completed the month with a rolling herd average of 17,799 pounds of milk per cow, yielding 685 pounds of butterfat. Other top herds were: — Tom and Grace Nicholas, Loganton, 16,916 pounds of milk, 672 pounds of butterfat. — Richard L. Schenck, Mill Hall, 17,418 pounds of milk, 665 pounds of butterfat.

The cow completing the highest lactation of 305 days or less was #37, a 6½ year-old Holstein owned by Ken Yearick, Mill Hall. #37 produced 21,843 pounds of milk testing at 4.0 percent, yielding 870 pounds of butterfat in 305 days.
