good idea to measure each item in a bucket or other suitable container and arrange buckets in the order in which materials are to be added to the tank. This will make it clear if everything has been added to each tank mixture.

If unsure about compatibility, always use the quart jar method, mixing chemicals in the same order as for a full-scale tank mix, using a pint of liquid carrier, onequarter teaspoon compatibility agent and about one level teaspoon of each pesticide. Mix gently and allow to stand. If the mixture is free of lumps, flakes or sludge it should be O.K.

Play it safe. Have a drum or at least a 5-gallon can of clean water, a bar of strong soap and a supply of towels on hand at all times to wash off any spills or splashes, Belt cautions. Be sure to wear rubber gloves and protective equipment. Don't take chances!

There will be a charge of \$4.00 per animal for the vaccination. This vaccine protects your animal for 3 years unless, it is the first rables vaccination it ever received. For first time vaccination cases, tha animal will need a booster shot next year.

All animals must be restrained. Dogs on leashes and cats in cages. Rabies is a fatal disease to both humans and their pets, and the incidence of rabies has more than doubled in the last year. Protect yourself and your pet and come to the Rabies Clinic.
