Cartoned egg movement was irregular but planned promotional activity was creating some interest. Supplies were usually adequate although several dealers reported increased competition to snare large type accounts.

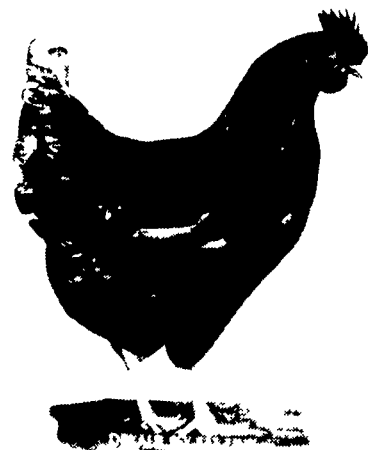
