

Local dairy promotion funds approved

HARRISBURG — The Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion Advisory Board approved more than \$33,000 in additional local promotion funding and elected a chairman and vice-chairman at its April 10 meeting.

In other business, board member Donald Duncan of Robesonia, Berks County, was elected to serve as chairman. Himself as a dairyman, Duncan has served as former president of the Keystone Milk Marketing Council. He is also president of the Berks County Dairy Farmers Association. Thad Woodward of Canton, Bradford County, was selected as the vice-chairman. He is manager of Eastern Milk Producers' Dairy

Products Division.

The two will direct the business of the 16-member panel created to oversee the dispersal of promotion funds and other transactions of the program.

The Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion is a voluntary program funded by dairy producers and designed to increase consumption and marketing of Pennsylvania dairy products.

USDA orders dairy promotion referendum

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Department of Agriculture has issued an order to hold a referendum among dairy farmers in the 60-day period beginning Aug. 1 on whether the Dairy Promotion and Research program should be continued after Sept. 30, according to Secretary of Agriculture John R. Block.

Block said he is required to conduct the referendum under the

provisions of the Dairy and Tobacco Adjustment Act of 1983, which authorized the program.

All dairy farmers who were engaged during April 1985 in the production of milk for commercial use will be eligible to vote. A majority of the dairy farmers voting must favor continuation of the program for it to remain in effect.

The Dairy Promotion and

Research Program is financed by a 15-cent per hundredweight assessment on all milk produced in the contiguous 48 states and marketed commercially by dairy farmers. The program is administered by a board of 36 dairy farmers appointed by the secretary of agriculture with representation based on area milk production.


