Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was improved but a bit irregular. At some plants clearances were fairly easy to maintain on whole birds but others were somewhat disappointed with current buyer interest. Most parts items had improved.
Live supplies were adequate. Weights were in a full range, but mostly desirable to heavy. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Undertone was cautiously firm.
