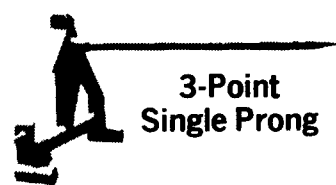

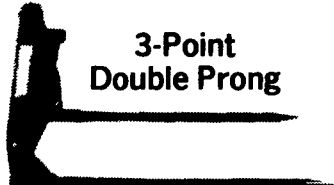

ROUND BALE MOVERS

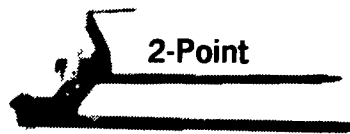


3-Point Single Prong

The Same Unit Can Be Used With One Prong For Center Of Bale Or Two Prongs For Under Bale.



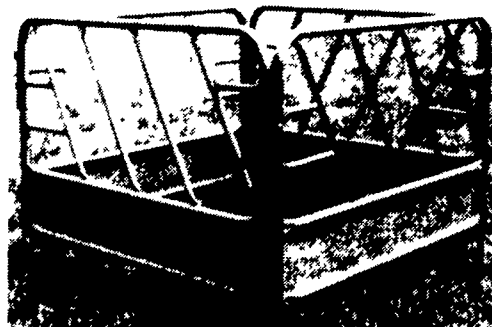

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HEAVY DUTY HAY BALE FEEDER



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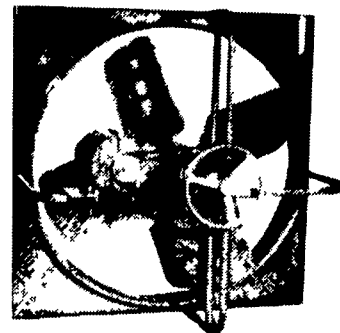
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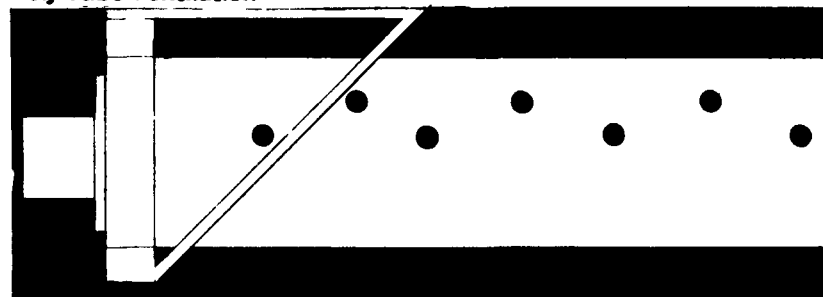
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
