our grass seedings to fail in spots,' explained Krout, "leaving us suceptable to erosion on some slopes. We were reluctant to work up the soil again before spring rains." Meanwhile, Gilbertsville farmer Ernest Long had rented the Conservation District's No-Till Grain Drill to plant oats on ground that adjoins the landfill This attracted the attention of the Dry weather last fall caused Boyertown Sanitary Disposal

Company.

After consulting with Bill Steuteville, No-Till Coordinator for Montgomery County, they decided to try no-tilling grass on their susceptable slopes this spring.

"We generally work with far-mers," says Steuteville, "but we were happy to assist in stabilizing the soil on the landfill. This is a critical area because of the steepness of the slopes. The agricultural principles are the same.'

Ernest Long used his tractor to do the planting.

Adds Steuteville, "I'm glad Ernie did the driving, I would have been very nervous on those slopes.
