HARRISBURG - The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture will conduct a hearing to receive public comments on proposed regulations for Manufactured Grade Milk on Wednesday, May 22 at 10 a.m in Room 309 of the Agriculture Building.

The proposed regulations

establish requirements for milk manufacturing purposed in accordance with Act 163 of 1982. They are designed to encourage improved farm sanitation in the production of milk for manufacturing, and to establish minimum standards for processing of milk into manufactured dairy products such as cheese and butter

The guidelines were published in

the May 4 edition of the Pennsylvania Bulletin. By law, written comments may be accepted for 30 days following publication.




