Market Comment: Movement of ready to cook whole birds was irregular but had slowed in total and was fair to good. Inquiry for parts was best on leg quarters. Interest on most other items was declining, and pricing was a bit easier. Live supplies were adequate. Weights were generally desirable to light. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. Undertone was steady to fully steady. Today's L.T.L. asking prices were 1 cent higher on U.S. Grade A at 53-51 cents. Estimated slaughter of broiler fryers in Delmarva (000). Estimated 5/23 2,003,000; Actual 5/16 1,664,000; Actual 5/21 1,725,000; Average Weights 5/21 4.33; Average Weights 5/14 4.18.
