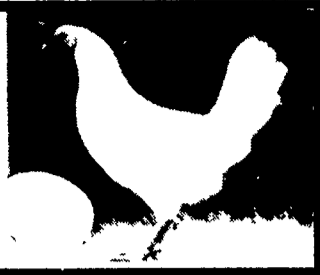

Market Comment: Prices are unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady. Cartoned egg orders picked up somewhat and was generally reported as about moderate. Retail feature interest was spotty. Mediums tightened up as sales to breakers and ads helped pull this size into a better balanced position. Large were still burdensome and often reported as difficult to move.

Extra large were usually adequate for current dealer needs.

Market Comment: Demand for ready to cook whole birds was light and unaggressive, and seller offerings were easily available to negotiation. Movement of parts showed some slight improvement at lower trending prices, but the call overall remained sluggish.

Live supplies were fully adequate to ample. Weights were mostly desirable to heavier than desired. Slaughter schedules were heavy. Undertone weak.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were generally 1 cent lower on U.S. Grade A at 52-60 cents.
