## Red meat output down 6% in April

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania's commercial red meat production, dressed weight basis, during April totaled 74.2 million pounds, down six percent from April 1984, according to the Pennsylvania Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Beef slaughter, 88.0 million pounds liveweight, was up three percent from April 1984. Total head slaughtered was 75,200, up two



percent. Liveweight averaged 1,171 pounds, an increase of 12 pounds. Veal slaughter was 3.9 million pounds liveweight, up 11 percent. Calf slaughter of 22,500 head was up eight percent, and average liveweight increased six pounds to 174 pounds.

Hog slaughter, ac 33.0 million pounds liveweight, was down 23 percent from a year earlier. Total head slaughtered was 142,000, down 24 percent, but the average liveweight increased two pounds to 233 pounds. Lamb and mutton slaughter was 1.5 million pounds liveweight, down 27 percent. The number slaughtered was 14,900, down 25 percent and the average liveweight decreased one pound to 98 pounds.

U.S. commercial red meat production, dressed weight basis, in April totaled 3.29 billion pounds, up seven percent from April 1984. Beef production, dressed weight basis, at 1.94 billion pounds was up nine percent over last year. Total head killed, at 2.97 million, was up four percent, and average liveweight increased 30 pounds to 1,097. Veal production at 41 million pounds was up 14 percent from a year ago. Calf slaughter of 270 thousand head was up nine percent, and the average liveweight increased eight pounds to 254.

Pork production totaled 1.29 billion pounds, up four percent from a year ago. The 7.38 million head killed was up three percent, and the average liveweight increased three pounds to 245. Lamb and mutton production at 30 million, was down 12 percent. Slaughter totaled 534,000 head, down 13 percent, but the average liveweight increased one pound to 113 pounds.





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
