

## Young cooperators to compete in Arlington

The YC program is designed to educate young dairy farmer members about cooperatives and to further expose them to the workings of the dairy industry, Barnett said. The program recognizes and develops leadership among the YCs, all between the ages of 21 and 35.

Sponsored by the Pennmarva

Dairymen's Federation, the YC contest is a culmination of a year's activities for the dairy couples and singles. Each contestant has had the opportunity to attend Board meetings, the annual delegate meeting and educational seminars.

Three other Federation mem-

bers—Captiol Milk Producers Maryland and Virginia Milk Producers Cooperative Association and Mid-Atlantic Division of Dairymen, Inc.—also select outstanding YCs at this program. The cooperatives do not select one Pennmarva couple, however.

Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative represents about 3,000 dairy farm families in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia. The Cooperative marketed more than 2.49 billion pounds of milk in fiscal 1984.

## Cornell prof wins award

URBANA, IL — Robert H. Foote, an animal scientist from Cornell University, received the 1985 "Upjohn Physiology Award" from the American Dairy Science Association, which held its annual meeting at the University of Illinois.

Foote was recognized for his research accomplishments in animal physiology, particularly those published during the past five years. He is known internationally for his research in animal reproduction, sperm physiology, artificial in-

semination, in vitro fertilization, and ovum and embryo transfer techniques for various animal species including dairy cows.

The Jacob Gould Schurman Professor of Animal Physiology, Foote is a faculty member in the New York State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Cornell. He recently was named the "Distinguished Andrologist for 1985" by the American Society of Andrology for his research contributions in animal physiology.


Previously, Foote has won several other research and teaching awards, including the American Society of Animal Science's Animal Physiology and Endocrinology Award; the national Association of Animal Breeders' Award for Research; the Spallanzani Award from the Italian Government; the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching; and the Professor of Merit Award and the Edgerton Career Teaching Award, both from Cornell.

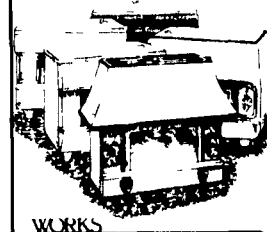

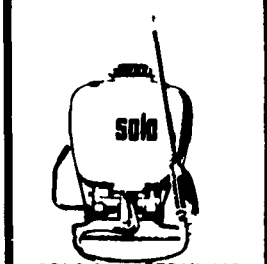
