Market Comment: Movement of ready to cook whole birds was moderate at best. Most sellers were able to clear product satisfactorily. Inquiry and movement of most part items was light and most trading was at lower price levels.

Live supplies were adequate to fully adequate. Weights were trending lighter. Slaughter schedules were reduced by a spot plant not operating and were light in total. Undertone was mixed buy only steady at best.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were unchanged on U.S. Grade A at 53-60 cents.

Report supplied by USDA Market Comment: Prices continued to trend higher on large and extra large; mediums unchanged. Cartoned egg movement

was mixed but moderate in total. Floor stocks varied from place to place but were generally in close balance of the larger sizes. Nest run inquiry created the bulk of activity causing sellers to hold most offerings with confidence.


