## New rotary cutter is stronger, lighter

SELMA, AL - The box section construction on Bush Hog's new 3100 series rotary cutters increases the cutters' strength while reducing the weight to allow smaller tractors to pull larger cutters.

The 3100 series consists of the 3108, which has a cutting width of 9 feet, the 10 1/2-foot 3126, and the 14-foot 3168. All three models easily handle brush up to two inches in diameter.

The 3100 series cutters are ideal for farmers, orchard owners, and government agencies who want to increase their cutting capacity without investing in new tractors.

When equipped with self-leveling pull-type hitches, the 3108 can be pulled with as little as 40 HP, the 3126 requires 50 HP and the 3168 needs 65 HP. Lift hitch horsepower requirements range from 50 for the 3108 to 70 for the 3168.


