Weights were mixed but usually desirable. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy with most plants closed for the Fourth. Undertone was firm.

Today's L.T.L. asking prices were unchanged to 2 cents higher on U.S. Grade A at 50-58 cents, and seller confidence was evident in all quarters.
